**WHAT:** Eric Briggs hails from Spitz Incorporated in Chadds Ford Pa. More supernovae are being discovered every year as technology advances. As a side effect, the astronomical naming convention used to sort supernovae has broken in an interesting way. The application of advanced telescopes on Earth and in space is "snapping" up many more supernovae. It is still possible for amateur astronomers to participate in discovering supernovae, with some similar technology. We will look at the new normal in this field, in which a single supernova discovery is no longer worthy of a name. But also in this reversal of fortune, young amateur astronomers can feel the rush of making scientific discoveries.

**Joe Depasquale** converts the rich datasets from the Chandra X-Ray Observatory into breathtaking view of the universe. He feels it to be a unique and rewarding challenge. He will give a brief overview of the Chandra program's development and touch on some of it's key discoveries while paying special attention to the processing behind the imagery.
