Gregory Kennedy has over 35 years educational experience including serving as the former Associate Curator for Manned Space Flight at the National Air and Space Museum for the Smithsonian's exhibits on aerospace medicine, Project Apollo, and rocketry. He was also Executive Director of the Space Center in Alamogordo, New Mexico and served and chaired the Education Committee of the International Astronautical Federation and Education Committee of the Nation Association of Rocketry, respectively. Mr. Kennedy had authored, co-authored, or edited eight books and dozens of articles on rocketry and space flight and was invited to present an historical overview on piloted high altitude balloon projects to a NASA Manned Ballooning Workshop in 2007.
